Welcome



Highlights from across the centres

Vocational Progression Centre (VPC)

Students from VPC have been volunteering making poppies to be sold in the local area. While doing this they have been learning about Remembrance Day and the significance of the poppies.

Wyvern House

Students at Wyvern House have been keen to support their local community and decided to produce Christmas treat pots for local food banks to help those in need over the holiday period.

Vocational Centre

The students have been working together to drive a community support project. They have collected donations and created parcels for local food banks in Wandsworth.

Lomond House

This term students at Lomond House have been busy learning new skills and have been trialling vocational courses such as horticulture, hair and beauty and caretaking.

Beaconsfield Centre


This term students from Teddington class have worked hard on their enterprise project making sensory Christmas trees to sell. The students have explored their senses through touch and exploration, feeling twigs and pine cones, textured fabrics and a variety of smells. They finished the Christmas trees off with lights and bells and the finished articles looked brilliant. They were then able to put their enterprise skills into place to sell them!

Camberwell Road

Students have settled in well at Camberwell Road and are beginning to explore the local community and have begun building links with employers and other organisations.

Opening of Camberwell Road

We were pleased to open a new centre this term; Camberwell Road in Southwark is split into two areas for students on our Skills for Work and Living programme and our WorkStart programme. There is also a dedicated area for our in-house Digital School where the creation of a digital suite is in progress. This term students have already been accessing Lego Education activities and game development. Next term they hope to begin creating podcasts, magazines, virtual reality and films!



Project SEARCH

Orchard Hill College is pleased to be part of Project SEARCH, a partnership venture which prepares young people for employment. The programme provides onsite internship experiences in real work settings so students can gain the skills to achieve paid employment. The college currently has nine interns at the Civic Centre in Uxbridge; the programme is going well and has continued to safely run work rotations despite restrictions being in place.

Virtual Events

This term has seen the launch of a number of virtual events, including Open Events, Coffee Mornings and Transition Events.

Our Open Events saw an 80% turnout for students, proving it to be an accessible option that was also enjoyable and informative. These events received positive feedback, as this attendee said: "The overview of the college was very insightful and the video tour was very useful. Overall, excellent event considering the circumstances - very smooth".

We also redesigned our Transition Event into an online forum. Welcoming 30 guest speakers, students, parents and carers were able to speak to professionals from supported housing and employment, specialist disability organisations and local community schemes providing opportunities for extending life and learning skills.

Students, parents and carers will be receiving our new transition booklet with contact details of these organisations in January.



Virtual Information, Advice and Guidance Events

At Orchard Hill College we offer information, advice and guidance sessions and coffee mornings as monthly online webinars throughout the year.

These webinars offer opportunities for parents and carers to find out key information and develop links with local groups and support organisations. Ashley Jordan-Diaper, Lead for Post 16 Partnerships, runs these sessions and offers opportunities to get advice on any concerns you may have around transition and a range of other topics.

After each webinar an information pack will be sent out to cover the main themes and signpost to the key organisations and groups.
